

# #914 Brant Mcclung, Porsche 914/6; #631 Thomas Murphy, Jaguar XKE. -story by Don Gwynne

CVAR's second event at Eagles Canyon Raceway was held in beautiful May weather, with puffy clouds over a clear blue sky. Umbrellas were popular items on the formula car grids for protection against the bright Texas sun.

During Friday's "test and tune" day, a group of Formula Vee drivers served a free lunch to all. Group 3's Team Geezer stepped up to provide gratis hot dogs and condiments for all CVAR competitors, crew, corner workers, and officials. Because last November at TWS a Geezer was awarded the AGITATOR OF THE YEAR AWARD, Team Geezer is eager to change their image. They asked to be known henceforth as "Hot Dogs" (the title currently given to most Group 1 drivers) or "the best of the wurst". The esprit d'corps of these CVAR Group 3 drivers is noteworthy.

A special ceremony honored Grover Maurer, who decided at age 77 that it was time to leave the racing to a younger crowd.

Grover has been a beloved fixture at CVAR races for years, driving his green #77 MG Midget in SFP (Spec) class. Grover's entire family came out to wish him well on his farewell weekend. He vowed to remain involved in future CVAR vintage events, just not as a driver.

Rob Ludlow's "barn find" 1957 Corvette made a welcome appearance, even though it was plagued all weekend with minor teething problems. This 283 cubic inch Corvette was initially owned and raced by Bud Ogle, and later was owned and raced by Rob Ludlow from 1975 through 1986. In 1986, an engine failure at Hallett, near Tulsa, OK, resulted in Rob putting his Corvette up on blocks in his own barn.

Twenty-two years later, he is resurrecting the car at Brad Balles' Alpha Garage facility, and Eagles Canyon was its first outing. Make no mistake, this is no over-restored princess more suitable for museum display; this is a real war horse, still bearing old scars. It was a treat for everyone to see this historic SCCA race car gradually coming alive again. CVAR's tech

inspector balked, however, at letting Rob onto the track shod with the same tires as that day in 1986 when his engine failed at Hallett (good job, David Griffith!).

In the true CVAR spirit, fellow racers stepped forward with a set of suitable tires, and Rob was good to go for the weekend. Unfortunately, a series of minor gremlins kept him from getting in very many good laps, but it was a beginning, and fun to watch. Brad loaned Rob the Alpha Garage A40 Sedan so that Rob could complete his weekend on track.

Another interesting car seen at Eagles Canyon was trailered all the way from Springfield, Missouri, by its owner/driver, Forrest Tindall. His metallic blue #17 Lola Mk1 contains quite a few pieces and parts from an even earlier Lola BR1 he once owned. That car is now on display in a UK museum.

Forrest said that the early design Weber sidedraft carbs on #17's 1500cc Ford non-crossflow engine originally came from an Aston Martin.

Easily the fastest closed-wheel car of the weekend was Sam LeComte's red 1970 FIA

Camaro. This awesome car has an extensive racing history, mostly in Mexico. It has always been a race car, and was raced extensively in Mexico from 1970 through 1982. Gene Felton restored and raced this SVRA Medallion car from 1986 to 1996. Sam LeComte bought it two years ago. 3R Racing in Denver set up the suspension, and did it well, judging from its blistering ontrack performance.

Sam has posted wins driving this car at the HSR Rolex at Daytona two years ago, at Miller last year, and at the Road Atlanta Mitty just a month ago. It is powered by a 350 cubic inch small block Chevy with downdraft Kinsler fuel injection. In Saturday's Group 1 race, Sam took the overall win and the FIA class-win the best time posted by a closed wheel car all weekend, 1:57.292, for a 76.7 mph average around the 2.5 mile Eagles Canyon course. Saturday evening's free Italian dinner for everyone was thanks to the generosity of Sam and his family. Unfortunately, mechanical problems cropped up during the Sunday points race, and Sam was DNF on Sunday afternoon.

A medium-sized CVAR **Group 2** field (13 FP, 6 EP, and 2 CS) started the first points race on Sunday afternoon.

Twenty minutes later, Herb Hilton took the overall win and the FP win driving his red and white #02 MG Midget. Kurt Gauthier's green and yellow #572 MG Midget crossed the line only four seconds behind the winner to take second overall and second in FP, rewarding his long tow from Boyce, LA.

John Hamilton, driving his orange #80 "Great Pumpkin" MGB, led CVAR President George Curl's blue #40 MGB to the EP class win, finishing fifth and seventh overall, respectively. John makes the long tow from Navarre, FL to nearly all CVAR events, and it sure paid off this trip.

Rodger Soucy won C Sedan, in eleventh spot overall, driving his blue #155 Mini-Cooper S.

Sam Partin placed second in C Sedan driving his beautiful red #44 Alfa 1300 Junior.

The **Group 3** (FV, SFP) race field was somewhat smaller, with 10 FVs and one Spec FP car, that of retiring Grover Maurer driving his green #77 MG Midget in his last CVAR race.

Every car finished the race, with Bill Griffith taking the overall win driving his red #5 Beach FV. Team Geezer's Mike Callahan finished a close second in his white & blue #68 Zink, less than one second in arrears. Grover Mauer finished his CVAR driving career with an unopposed win in SFP class on Sunday.

Of the eighteen cars entered in **Group 4** (VA, VB, VC, CM, FFJr, FJr), ten started the Sunday points race. The Group 4 drivers voted unanimously to shorten their race from 20 minutes down to 15 minutes due to unseasonably warm temperatures. Jim Yule's surprisingly quick gray #1 Elva 100 took the overall win and the front engined Formula Junior (FFJr) class, followed closely by visitor

Forrest Tindall's (front engined CM) blue #17 Lola Mk1.

Third overall and first in VA class was Fred Crowley driving his red and white #76 Austin Healey 3000. John Page in his white #61 Alfa Spider Veloce finished ahead of Lou Marchant's green #186 MGA to take the VB class win. Reed Yates drove his green #11 MG TF to the VC win, finishing approximately 13 seconds ahead of rival Gary Bauer's yellow #05 Bugeyed Sprite.

Fourth points race of Sunday afternoon was for **Group 6** (FA, FC, FF1, FF2). The Group 6 drivers followed the lead of the Group 4 drivers and also voted for a 15 minute race. At the end of the period, it was Pete Hoekenga who took the overall win and the FF2 class, driving his blue and yellow #1 Lola T-540.

Trevor Bond's bright green #98 LeGrand Mk21 was 9.9 seconds behind at the checker, to finish second overall and second in FF2. FF1 class winner was Chalmer McWilliams, who placed third overall in his green & white #19 Lotus 51A. With Stephen Page's white & blue #29 March Atlantic car out with mechanical woes, Kent Liming enjoyed the FA class win in his red #15 Centaur with a 19 second margin ahead of Steve Garrisi's red & white #44 Fiat Abarth.

Page's consolation was that he set fastest lap

of the weekend during the Sunday morning non-points race. Stephen set this mark while charging to the front for the overall win after starting near the back of the field. He hustled his March around the 2.5 mile ECR track for a best lap of 1:53.668, for an average speed of 79.178 mph.

The penultimate race of the weekend was for **Group 7** (CP, DP, BS) and it saw a good-sized field of 21 cars that took the starter's flag.

First through third overall were all CP Porsche 911s. George Kopecky was first in his psychedelic #97, followed only a half-second later by Steve Kent in his red #58, followed by Ned Cullen's white & maroon #12.

Fourth overall and first in DP was Norm Dodson driving his red #1 Lotus Super 7, only 1.7 seconds behind overall winner Kopecky. Tim Woodruff scored a first in B Sedan, eleventh overall, driving his blue #74 BMW 2002.

The Group 1 (AP, BP, AS, FIA) big iron rolled out for the last race of the day. Although Sam LeComte's red #156 FIA Camaro was dominant at first, as it had been all weekend, it faded after three laps with a mechanical problem.

Jody O'Donnell took over in his white & green #46 Corvette and was never headed, finishing first overall and first in AP class. Seth Higgins

passed Daryl Gough's #167 red/white/blue FIA Corvette in the fifth lap to put his brown #31 FIA Porsche RSR into second overall and first in FIA class. Tony Shores took fourth overall and first in A Sedan driving his light blue & black #00 Mustang, with Tod Zelinski finishing right behind him for the B Production win in his white #5 Mustang.

Eagles Canyon looks like a fine addition to CVAR's annual schedule. The facility is first rate and is sure to attract racers from all over North America.
