The CVAR group made the trek to the region just west of Tulsa, Oklahoma for the annual Spring Races over the weekend of March 31-April 1, 2007 at the newly resurfaced Hallett Motor Racing Circuit. The entrants were challenged by the weather of the previous week as the region had torrential rains and many tornados reported. No permanent damage was suffered by the track, however, so when the sun broke through for Sunday there was rejoicing by all and racing by many. During the inclement weather leading up to Sunday, though, the terrific track personnel at Hallett were much in evidence to remove hapless competitors and spectators (as well as writers) from the slippery, slidey stuff. The Stevens Family did their usual job of combining efficiency with hospitality to make the event a great time for everyone.

Group 1 for big bore production cars Sunday points race saw great action. Bobby Steffens in his AP Corvette took the honors with Daryl Gough following him for second and Jeff Anderson finally had his Lola T212 fully on song and finished third. Group 2, as usual was a large group for the points race on Sunday. Perrenial fast guy, Mark Hansen brought his FP Sprite all the way from Casper, Wyoming along with his buddy, Ron Randolph (FP Bugeye) from Colorado. Sohn gave a fine performance to finish second. By the way, long time competitor Douglas Doidge was on hand as usual with his blue

Midget. What was different was that he had along a new co-pilot, traded his trusty school bus transporter for a Class A motor home, and didn't stop smiling all weekend in spite of mechanical issues with his race car. Couldn't happen to a nicer guy.

The top of the time sheets in **Group 3** for FV were only unusual in that the name of Roger Bailey was missing. Roger has sold his racing car and is moving to some place where there is snow in the winter. We may miss him as

much as he misses the weather of Houston. The racing in FV is always very good and this weekend was no exception. The same guys always seem to run at the front and have a great time dicing and slicing with one another and then laugh about it after the race. This is the attitude that is typied by "Team Geezer Racing" with Mike Callahan and John Gaudette. Callahan is nowadays to be found at the front of the pack mixing it up with the likes of Yule, but Gaudette has been steadily improving and is about to crack the barrier. Dave went from fifteenth to fifth during one of the Saturday races and finished the points race on Sunday in second place just under two seconds behind Callahan. It was a very appropriate number as he led every lap of every race but for three laps and finished all his races in first. His margin of victory varied from five to fifteen seconds and he was always about one second a lap quicker than any of his competitors. Second for most
