Near perfect weather and a good number of entrants made for a fun and successful weekend of CVAR racing at MSR-Houston. The Fall Drivers School included six students, ranging from first timers to old heads knocking off the rust.

During lunchtime on Saturday, exhibition rides in race cars were immensely popular, with more than 20 workers and spectators enjoying the opportunity to see "what's it like out there". On Saturday night, pizza and beer was hosted by Race Chairman Mike Briggs.

Sunday morning's special feature event was a 25-minute **CONTINENTAL EUROPEAN** race for non-British cars, with 10 of them coming to the line (eight Porsches, one BMW, and one NSU). Carl Janin sat on pole in his white #18 Porsche RSR, with Bassam Al Haddad alongside in his #13 white Porsche 911. When the race started, Bassam jumped

into the lead, only to drop out on the sixth lap. Janin went on from there to take the overall win and the FIA class win. After a mid-race battle with a couple of Porsche drivers, Tim Woodruff finished second overall to win B

Sedan in his blue #74 BMW 2002. Jay Zittrer finished third overall and second in FIA class in his silver #39 Porsche 914-6. School student Bjorn Dischington put in an impressive drive, starting last and finishing fourth overall in his blue and orange #587 Porsche 911. In fifth overall, John Kish won the C Production class driving his red #58 Porsche 911E. Tom Giertz won the E Production class with a sixth overall finish in his silver #59 Porsche 914.

Sunday afternoon's races began with the big thunder of GROUP 1. Of the 16 original entrants, only nine came to the line for the points race. Phil Mulacek sat on the pole in his real-deal blue #19 Cobra, with Alain Vinson alongside in his white #18B Shelby GT-350. They ran in that order for the first several laps, then began a mid-race back and forth that eventually had Mulacek spinning and dropping back. Vinson took the overall win and the B Production class win. CVAR President Herb Hilton finished second overall to win the A Sedan class in his yellow #17 Mustang. Jim Sharp took second in A Sedan with his yellow #85 Camaro in third overall. After starting on the second row, Louis Gladfelter dropped out on the second lap with a clogged fuel system in his white #55 Shelby GT-350. Jim Sandberg took an unopposed A Production class win in his red #84 Corvette.

Early go-homes reduced the GROUP 2 field from 22 entrants down to only seven starters for the points race. CVAR's Chief Instructor Berkeley Merrill started on pole in his silver #12 Porsche 914, and eventually finished first overall to win the E Production class, but not without a mid-race struggle with Pete Sandy's white and blue #04 Bugeyed Sprite. Sandy led briefly then dropped off. Ronald Reed also benefitted when Sandy's Sprite faltered, and finished second overall and second in E Production with his yellow

and red #9 Porsche 914. Gary Reed won the F Production class in his yellow #15 MG Midget in third overall. Drew Fisher took an unopposed C Sedan win in the red #2 Mini Cooper in sixth overall.

The **GROUP 3** Formula Vee drivers hung in there on Sunday afternoon, with 19 of 27 entrants coming to the grid. CVAR Race Coordinator William Wolfe sat on pole driving his white #68 Zink Z-5, with Dwight Calkins alongside in his red #87 Lynx B. Elliot Barron put on a stunning drive, carving up through the pack from 15th on the grid to take the lead on the fourth lap and go on to take the overall win, slightly more than two seconds ahead of Dwight Calkins in second place. William Wolfe finished third. Student George Curl (IV) finished ninth overall in his own white #42

Zink C-4, and fellow student Brandall Binion finished in 14th overall in Bigger Hammer's red and blue #24 Stinger.

CVAR's more historic GROUP 4 brought

six cars to the grid, with the smallest displacement car in the field sitting on pole. Gary McFarlane really had his white #91 "Thundermug" humming, and went on to notch a flag-to-flag overall win and the VC class win. Lou Marchant's BRG #183 MGA crossed the line about 15 seconds behind Thundermug to

win the VB class. Spec Sprite racers Jackson Williams and David Turner battled back and forth for the SFP

class win, with the green #72 Austin Healey Sprite coming out on top. Behind these two, Chris Kellner took the VA class win in his white over red #23 Austin Healey 3000 in fifth overall.

Six of the GROUP 6 open wheel entrants came to the grid on Sunday afternoon. Edward

Copley sat on pole in his red #43 Ralt, led from flag to flag, turned the fastest lap, and won the FA class. Angus Lemon placed

second overall to win the FF1 class in his purple #86 Merlyn. Jim Gewinner won the B Sports Racing class in third overall driving his green #33 Lotus 23B. The FF3 class win went to Jeremy Suydam's white #73 Royale RP3 in fourth overall.

The GROUP 7 grid was the last of the day, with only

four cars coming to the grid. The blue #55 Fiat Sport Coupe driven by Cynthia Trifilio sat on pole and led from flag to flag for the overall win and the B Sedan class win.

Fastest lap, however, was turned in by the second overall car of Phil Lee. His #66 red Triumph TR-4 won the D Production class in the process. John Kish won the C Production class in his red #58 Porsche 911E in third overall. Russ Rosenberg's white #83 Yenko Stinger was less than three seconds behind Kish at the checkered flag to finish second in D Production.

CVAR's last race of the year will be the Race For The North Pole of Texas, Dec. 8-10 at Eagles Canyon Raceway.
