and Vintage Motorsport magazine. The Lunch Laps race car rides on both Saturday and Sunday were a huge hit, and raised a lot of money for the Morgan Adams Foundation.

The infield was smooth enough, fun, if not overly technical and the banking was frighteningly (at first) FAST! For example, some Group 7 drivers reported that they were going about 10 mph faster than on the straights at COTA and VIR.

Over 200 people attend the "Dinner with the Drivers" on Saturday night. They were treated to a great performance by The Chris Watson Band. A charity auction had members bidding against each other for tires, tickets and a quilt made by Judy Kellner and Jean Womble that topped out at \$2850, bid by Jim Barron. Robinson, Burt and Shelley Williams, Tim Woodruff, Brandall Binion, Jeff Norris, Cragg Eubanks, *Vintage Motorsport*, *Victory Lane* and Kyle Bush. CVAR raised \$57,000 for the Morgan Adams Foundation, which exceeded our \$50K goal.

When the Sunday afternoon CVAR Championship 15 minute points races began, earlier problems with the track PA system had been solved, and the garage areas, paddock and pits were subjected to running commentaries from amateur racing announcers Don Gwynne and Steve Smargiasso.

The first points race brought out 16 GROUP 3 Formula Vees. Although not the fastest cars of the weekend, it produced some of the very best racing. At the end of 8 laps of the 2.63 mile course, the winner was Elliott Barron, driving his silver #23 Pegasus. The road course is a combination of about 2/3 of the NASCAR oval, combined with a wiggly trip through the infield. About four seconds separated him from the second and third place cars. But those two were neck and neck at the finish. Jason White came second in his black and red #98 Zink C4. Hunter Barron's

red #113 Kellison Mk2 finished third, only a tenth of a second behind White.

CVAR's GROUP 4 had 12 entrants, but on Sunday afternoon only 5 of them came to the grid. Austin's Howard Phillips led the way in his green #11 Alfa Romeo GTV to take the overall win and the BS class win. New Mexico's Henry Morrison placed second overall and first in VB class driving his white #10 Elva Courier. Fellow New Mexico resident Erik Jacobsen placed third overall and second in VB class driving his yellow #27 Austin Healey Sprite. Texan Chris Kellner placed fourth overall to win the VA class in his red and white #23 Austin Healey 3000. Although both were a lap down on the leader, Kellner and Bob Pinkston had a whale of a race. Pinkston's red #7 VW Beetle was just 0.7 seconds behind Kellner at the checkered flag, to win the recently created G4T class.

The **GROUP 6** (FA, FF1, FF2, FF3, and B Sports Racing) field had 22 entries, but for various reasons, only 14 came to the grid.

Class of the field was Rick Wark and his red #70 March Formula Atlantic. He ran off and hid from the rest, finishing half a minute ahead of the second place car. Greg Smith brought his red #6 Swift DB1 home behind Wark to win the FF3 class. Angus Lemon and Tom Linton battled for the FF1 class win, with less than 0.3 seconds difference at the checkered flag. Lemon's purple #86 Merlyn

11A/17A took the FF1 win, with Linton's blue and white #71 Winkelmann WDF1 placind fourth overall and second in FF1. Jim Gewinner took an unopposed B Sports Racing win at fifth overall in his green #33 Lotus 23B. The FF2 class win was taken by Charles Daniels from Albuquerque, NM with his yellow #63 Crossle CF25/32.

The **GROUP 7** (C Production, D Production, B Sedan) race produced an epic battle between the red/

white/blue #57 Datsun 501 driven by Michael Lovay and the orange #24 Porsche 914-6 driven by Tom Taff. After 9 laps, Lovay took the checkered flag and the B Sedan class win with a 1.4 second lead over Taff's C Production Porsche. Thomas Schluter's blue #77 Datsun 240Z finished third overall and

second in C Production, about 15 seconds behind Taff. Donnie Cluck drove his yellow #39 Datsun 510 to fourth overall and second in B Sedan. Race organizer and recently published racing author Russ Rosenberg won the D Production class driving his white #83 Yenko Stinger.


CVAR's Big Thunder, GROUP1 (A Production, B Production, A Sedan, FIA) fielded a spectacular field of 19 cars. 13 more were entered but didn't come to the grid for the points race. Jacob Ammon's silver #27 Chevrolet Corvette finished first overall to win the A Production class, finishing just less than four seconds ahead of Seth Higgins' blue #31 Porsche RSR, which won the FIA class. Charles Jones had his white and gold #289 Shelby GT-350H wound tight, to finish third overall and win the B Production class. This same car was SCCA's B Production National Champion "back in the day." Less than two seconds behind Jones came Jeff Garrett in his blue #389 notchback Mustang to win the A Sedan class.

Last race of the event was for Group 2 (E Production, F Production). San Antonio's Stefan Schluter finished first overall to win the E Production class in his orange #60 Porsche 914-4. Ken Morris had his black #08 MGB running well, finishing second overall and second in E Production, about 9 seconds behind Schluter. Thirty seconds farther back, Mike Glass won the F Production class in third overall driving his black #13 MG Midget.

CVAR's next event is the Brian Goldman Races and School, MSR-H, Feb 22-24. Brian was a founding member of CVAR and a constant supporter. Sadly, he recently succumbed to a massive stroke. Brian will be sorely missed by all who knew him.
