

CVAR held its 15th Annual Vintage Fall Festival during the weekend of November 3-5, 2006 at Texas World Speedway. Saturday's races were the last of 2006 to count towards CVAR's Championship Points Standings, along with some bonus races held on Sunday including two enduros.

Saturday's **Group 1** (AP, BP, ASR, AS, FIA) final 2006 points race was won by a healthy application of cubic inches and driving skill, in the form of Bob Caudle's white #83 AP 427 Corvette. He led every lap to the overall and AP win. Second overall, first in FIA class, was the orange #9 1973 Porsche RSR driven by Steve Kent. Third overall and second in FIA class was Tom Upton's freshly rebuilt red #77 1972 Pantera. Fourth overall and first in BP was Roy Allen, driving his blue #59 1966 Shelby GT-350 Mustang. John Fershtand won AS in his blue #47 1969 Boss 302 Mustang, and Jeff Anderson took an unopposed win in ASR driving his yellow and white #29 1971 Lola T212.

The **Group 2** (FP, CS) final 2006 points race was won overall by Bill Gardner, driving his blue

#40 1963 Austin Healey Sprite in F Production class. The winner of C Sedan, placing fifth overall, was Tom Davies in his blue and white #9 1966 Mini-Cooper S. Finishing between Gardner's Midget and Davies' Mini were P. D. Sohn in his blue #73 MG Midget, Pete Sandy in his white and blue #04 1959 bugeyed Sprite, and Steve Coleman in his purple #25 1972 MG Midget.

In Saturday's **Group 3** (FV, SFP) points race, Roger Bailey in his yellow and blue #45 1972 Caldwell D13 held off repeated and determined challenges by Bill Griffith in his red #5 Bigger Hammer FV, finishing just 0.024 seconds ahead for the overall and FV class win. Grover Maurer, driving his green #77 1972 MG Midget, briefly led Group 3's SFP class near the end, but Mike Vecellio and his yellow and black #3 1972 MG Midget re-took the lead with only two laps to go and won the "Spec" class by only 0.022 seconds, an even narrower margin of victory than seen in the FV class. Mike finished in 7th overall behind the first six FV cars.

With 12 cars starting Saturday's Group 4 (VA, VB, VC, HP, BSR, DSR) points race, and 10 different classes represented, odds were pretty good that lots of folks would win their respective class unopposed, and that's exactly how it came down. First overall and first in CM class was Bruce Revennaugh driving his white #36 1956 Lotus 11. Second overall and first in VA class was Fred Crowley, driving his red #76 1962 Austin Healey 100/6. Fred set a new CVAR track record at TWS for VA, turning a 2:06.356. John Lopez won CSR driving his red #93 Lotus 11 Westerfield. Pablo Gonzales won FC in his green #21 Lotus. Dan Chapman won FJr in his green #28 Cooper. Paul Flanery won BSR in his green #41 Merlyn, and Mike Orlie won VB in his blue #18 Porsche 356. John Furlow, Sr. won DSR in his rare silver and red #37 1962 Dolphin Abarth, and set a new CVAR DSR track record at TWS with a 2:23.919 lap. Gary Bauer won VC in his yellow #05 bugeyed Sprite. Karl Jackson won HP driving his red #95 Fiat 850 Abarth.

Drivers within the various race groups collected hundreds of dollars from within their respective groups, and presented the cash to essentially all the workers and officials who make the races possible. To say that the volunteer workers were surprised and appreciative would be understating their reactions. season. Kent Liming's red #15 Centaur won FA class, finishing 11th overall. Second and third overall were FF1 drivers Patricio Junco, blue & silver #32 Lotus 51B, and Steve Smith, blue #2. Jeff Anderson, driving his black #16 Brabham BT29, set a new CVAR class record at TWS on his way to the FB win. Robert Metcalf won FF2 driving Stephen Page's red #30 Crossle.

Group 6's S7 class was won by Chalmer McWilliams driving his blue & silver #01 S7, after a close race with Jeff Sloan, white & silver #8 S7. Chalmer's victory margin was only .03 seconds. Andrew Fawcett lowered the CVAR S7 track record to 1:58.130 along the way to a third in class finish driving his yellow #42 Lotus 7.

Group 7 (CP, DP, EP, BS) set several new CVAR class records at TWS. Chalmer McWilliams placed first overall and first in EP driving his green #64 Lotus 7, lowering the CVAR EP record at TWS to 2:00.090. Second overall and first in CP was Vernon Shade, driving his orange #808 Porsche

Mustang AS in 9th position, of a total of 18 cars. He assumed the lead by the 6th lap, and never let it go, winning A Sedan class as well as finishing first overall. Mark Hargrave started 10th in his red #56 Shelby GT-350, and finished second overall, first in B Production, 2.56 seconds behind Shores. Michael Saxe brought his red #979 Porsche 911 into third overall, first in FIA class, 15.8 seconds behind the leader.

Sunday Open Wheel 1 Hour Enduro - A mandatory 5 minute pit stop, with driver out of the car, threw an unfamiliar twist at the formula car

crowd. Mike Bufler started in third, and led all but the first four laps to take a convincing overall and FF2 win in his green #02 Van Diemen. Timing & scoring added a 5 minute penalty to his total time, however, for failing to make the required pit stop! His three lap lead over the second overall car of Stephen Page & Robert Metcalf (which did perform the mandatory 5 minute pit stop) was somehow allowed to stand, notwithstanding the assessment of a time penalty (?!). The Page/Metcalf red #30 Crossle was thus recorded as having finished second overall and second in FF2, and Pete Hoekenga in his blue & yellow #1 Lola T540 finished third overall and third in FF2. FF1 was won by Patricio Junco in his blue and silver #32 Lotus 51B. Andrew Barron pitted his bronze and black #93 Lotus 61 FF and hopped out with a driver's suit soaked in gasoline. A fuel leak had ruined his chances, but thankfully didn't ignite and ruin his whole weekend!

Sunday Closed Wheel 1 Hour Enduro - The final event on Sunday was the closed wheel Enduro event, which was eventually won overall by the team of Tom Upton and David Fershtand, driving Tom's red #77 FIA Pantera. They started the race
