# **CVAR Driver's School And Races**

## Texas World Speedway, TX

September 9-11, 2011

The Fall Drivers School & Races at TWS enjoyed good weather but had a smaller turnout (approx. 120 cars) than the record entry seen in February. Friday was "test, tune & practice" day for the experienced drivers, and a day of education for six students.

CVAR sees development of new vintage racing drivers as its most important responsibility. Every student must attend every "chalk talk" session, no excuses accepted. On-track sessions are supervised by experienced CVAR instructors.

Each student's car is subjected to a rigorous safety inspection; full compliance with CVAR's vintage-correct car preparation rules can be partially overlooked the first time out, but safety provisions cannot.

CVAR's Fall 2011 Student Class included: Monda Hanna, black CP Porsche 914-6, #5 Mike Glass, blue FP MG Midget, #14 Tom O'Grady, yellow FV Lynx, #52 Lee Romine, gray BSR Lotus 23C, #3 Lee Wilkins, green FIA Porsche 911RS,

Jeff Garrett, blue AS Mustang, #389

The last two on the list, Lee Romine and Lee Wilkins, are experienced CVAR racers getting back into the fray. They attended the school in order to renew their long-expired VMC licenses.

The Sunday afternoon points races went something like this...

In the **Group 3** (FV and SFP) race, Mike Callahan brought his white #68 Zink Z-5 home first overall and first in FV. Although Mike led every lap of the race, it wasn't without a fight from Ed Ziegler's red #5 Beach 5C. Dwight Calkins got in front of Ziegler briefly on the sixth lap, but Ziegler promptly took the spot back, only to face an end of race charge by Bruce Revennaugh who pulled to within two seconds of him at the finish to place third. The SFP "Spec Sprite" group started in its own pack behind the FV starters, and Gary Emery brought his green #31 A-H Sprite home to take the class win, moving up from 13th on the grid to 11th overall at the finish.

Group 4 (FFJr, FJr, VA, VB and VC) was won by Mike Vecellio driving his VB-class black #12 EMPI Crusader, but not without a strong challenge from Charles Bamford in his blue #34 Cooper T56 FJr. Dan Ruehs held third overall and first in VA from start to finish driving his 1959 white #51 Corvette, one of the few such cars being vintage-raced with the period-correct heavy duty drum brakes. Gary McFarlane took an unopposed VC win , finishing seventh overall, driving his historic white #91 "Thundermug"

H-Modified special, powered by Crosley. Area patriarch Lon McKinstry took an unopposed win in his green #2 Elva 100 front engined Formula Junior (FFJr).

A thirteen car field of **Group 6** (FA, FF1, FF2 and BSR) competitors led off the points races. Houston driver Steve Smith led convincingly from start to finish, winning overall and the FA class driving

his red #27 Ralt RT-1. Steven Jacobs was flying in his white #69 Dulon MP-15, placing second overall and first in FF2 class. "Novice" school student Lee Romine took third overall and first in B Sports Racing driving his grey #3 Lotus 23C. Angus Lemon's steady drive was rewarded by an FF1 class in his recently acquired blue (purple maybe?) #86 Merlyn 11A.

The top three finishers in the **Group 7** (CP, DP, & BS) race were Porsches. Richard Reeves' orange #78 914-6 nipped Ron Shade by three seconds for the overall win and the CP win. Shade's blue & yellow #810 Porsche 911T, on the other hand, was more than half a minute ahead of the third overall car, George Kopecky's psychedelic #97 911S. The first non-Porsche was Dr. Berkeley Merrill and his silver and red #4 Datzun 240Z in fourth overall and fourth in CP. Tim Woodruff was all alone in B Sedan, finishing ninth overall in his blue #74 BMW 2002. The lone D Production car, Joe Foster's black #16 Alfa Romeo Spyder, was unfortunately DNF after three laps.

The penultimate race of Sunday afternoon was for "big thunder" **Group 1** (AS, AP, BP & FIA). After starting fifth on the grid, Sam LeComte brought his blue #67 Camaro to second overall by the second lap, but pole-sitter Tom Upton led the first ten laps driving his red FIA #77 DeTomaso Pantera. But... it was an eleven lap race, and Sam nipped Tom at the finish by less than half a second to take the overall win and the A Sedan class win. Dr. Michael Saxe had a solid grip on third overall from start to finish, and second in FIA class, driving his orange #979

Porsche Carrera RS. Mark McIlyar brought his blue and white #33 Corvette from 13th at the green flag to fourth overall by the second lap, and held it to the finish for the A Production class win. Likewise, CVAR VP and Chief Steward Greg Reynolds brought his white #89 Shelby GT-350 from 14th on the grid up to finish fifth overall to take the B Production class win.

The final points race on Sunday afternoon was for **Group 2** (FP & EP). Polesitter John Setar, having graduated from a beautifully prepared silver MGA to an equally well prepared yellow & orange #30 Porsche 914, led the rest of the way to the checkered flag. John thus also won the E Production class, after Jay McClanahan's orange #117 MG Midget dropped out after the second lap. CVAR driving instructor Bill Haga

chased Setar to the line in his dark green #6 MGB to finish second overall and second in EP. It wasn't easy for Haga, however, because William Gardner had his blue #45 A-H Sprite really cooking, crossing the line just 0.4 seconds behind the MGB to win F Production.

CVAR's final race of the season will be held at Texas World Speedway in College Station, Texas on November 4-6, 2011. This 20<sup>th</sup> Fall Vintage Festival will feature the Allard "Gathering of the Clan II" and CVAR's season-end awards dinner and trophy presentation.

## A Great Racing Team: Charlie And Martha Barns


The Saturday evening dinner program at TWS was provided by one of CVAR's most experienced drivers, Charlie Barns, who began SCCA racing an Alfa Romeo in 1959! Last season, Charlie was still lapping TWS in less than 2:00 driving his red McLaren M1B. He spoke eloquently about his love for vintage racing, but said he had decided it was finally time for him to quit going fast. Martha Barns, standing at her husband's side, received Charlie's profuse thanks and a lot of credit for her unwavering support. She told the group about her early exposure to the world of sports car racing thanks to Charlie. Early in their marriage, Charlie put her in the driver's seat of a Formcar Formula Vee for the Ladies Race during the Nassau Speed Weeks in 1965. She told the group she could have won, if only Charlie had given her a faster car! Charlie then drove the same FV in the 1965 Nassau GP of VWs. The race was won by Chris Amon driving a Beach, so it wasn't fast enough for him either. The couple had traveled to Nassau following the ARRC runoffs at Daytona just earlier. Not coincidentally, Charlie was the first Formcar FV dealer in the DFW area, along with his Merlyn dealership.

Charlie brought an interesting table display of fifty years of racing memorabilia, including photos, articles, and some special trophies, including one for his 1964 G-Modified SCCA National Championship win at Riverside, as described in the biographical article "Charlie Barns and his Collection" in the August 2007 issue of Victory Lane, pp. 40-41.

Veterans Lynn Kysar and John Matlack received Charlie's praise and thanks. Both of them also rose to speak. Lynn not only raced a Merlyn GM car similar to Charlie's "back in the day", he towed both cars all over the country, whereas Charlie often piloted his own Cessna 310 to the races. Lynn also had the distinction of driving Charlie's works-supported Lotus Cortina in a six hour Trans-Am at Green Valley in September 1966, finishing second in class. The reason that Charlie was not driving his own car was because he had been tagged to co-drive one of the red & gold Alan Mann Lotus Cortinas with John Whitmore. Unfortunately, Whitmore crashed the car early in the race, so Charlie never got his turn.

John Matlack has worked alongside Charlie for decades and Charlie gratefully acknowledged his unfailing support and pit crew work. In addition to being a great friend and crackerjack mechanic, Matlack is a racing historian in his own right, and can go for hours, especially as regards the Chaparral folks from Midland. John then explained what an honor that membership in the Road Racing Driver's Club (RRDC) is. RRDC is a US organization made up of many of the America's and Europe's most successful racing drivers. Members are elected by their peers and include Formula One World Champions, Indy-500 winners, Champion Sports Car Drivers, and top American amateur road racers. The membership also includes leading industry professionals, race officials, and motorsports journalists who have made significant contributions to the sport. John urged those interested to browse the www.rrdc. org website and scan down the list of members. It is truly a who's who of road racing. The name "Charlie Barns" has been on the RRDC membership list since the mid-sixties.

After Charlie, Lynn and John spoke, Don Gwynne briefly noted that Bob Winkelmann, the current owner of the ex-Barns/ex-Gwynne Lotus Cortina B Sedan, has shipped the car to England, where he and Robs Lamplough (Google him and be impressed) are preparing the car for next year's 3 Hour vintage enduro at Spa Francorchamps in Belgium. Wink noted that between Robs and himself, the car will have more than 100 years of driving experience on tap when it comes to the grid. And the car itself has 45 years of experience, as noted above.

After Don quieted down and went back to taking pictures, it was question & answer time. When asked his favorite tracks, Charlie answered Road America and TWS! When asked what was his favorite car of all he has driven, he said that his green IROC Camaro was the best handling car of all. Whereupon Sam LeComte immediately began negotiations to buy the car! The assembled racers, workers and guests then gave Charlie and Martha a standing ovation, both for his exemplary half-century of racing, and for his excellent talk.
